The 2024-2025 class emphasizes the patient safety, quality, and value efforts of teams, and includes robust content on equity developed in partnership with the UW Medicine Office of Healthcare Equity. We invite individuals and small teams (optimal size of 3-8) from all UW clinical departments and care units to register. Improvement projects should align with institutional and departmental priorities.

Gain Hands-On Experience through Applied Learning

Participants apply the curriculum through a mentored improvement project during the course. Projects can range widely—from traditional quality and safety efforts to clinic flow challenges, and from department or division administrative efforts (e.g., enhancing an HR process or improving grant administration) to improvement work addressing diversity, equity, and inclusion.
